- Good analytical and problem solving skills with the ability to identify and prioritise needs and risk and translate these into action, including the ability to risk assess and safety plan
- A solid understanding of and commitment to safeguarding and confidentiality
- A valid driving licence and access to a vehicle
- Ability to be self-reflective, whilst working with families and young people, in own personal and professional development and in supervision
- Experience of communicating clearly, concisely and diplomatically with a wide range of people
